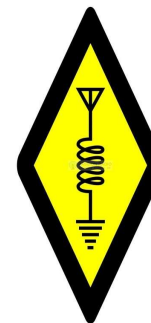
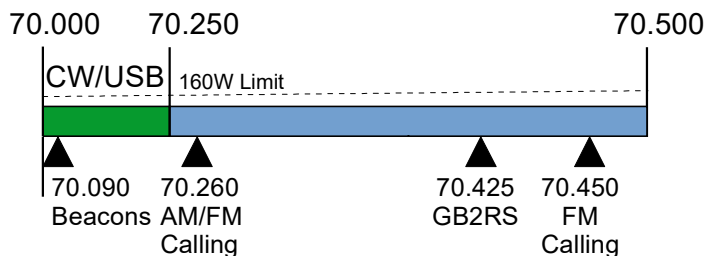
200Hz = CW

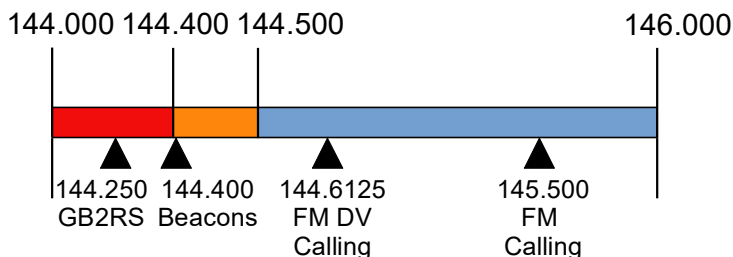
6m (50MHz)



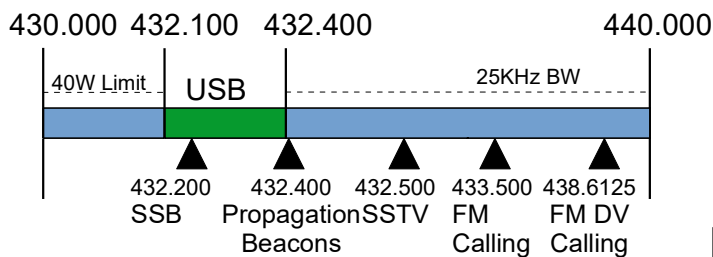
4m (70MHz)
